Overview of the Course

The modules included in this award develop a variety of management themes, then focuses on Managing Information Systems and Technologies. The focus of this award and the expected orientation of the Dissertation is on Information Systems Knowledge as an essential element assuring competitiveness of the contemporary firms, managing global corporations, creating business value, and providing useful products and services to the customers.

Organization of Studies

The length of the award is two years. The delivery pattern is such that you will study one module at a time following a sequence at the beginning of each academic year. Each module will be delivered for a period of two months divided into the following three periods:

Preparatory period – three weeks

Face-to-face delivery period – two consecutive weekends

Revision & assessment period – three

The research phase runs throughout the whole award. By the end of the taught modules, you will have approved dissertation title and have dissertation mentor designated.
